How does Canary work?

Canary works by placing a few discreet sensors in your home. These sensors will monitor if everything is as it should be.

It does this by checking things that are agreed between you and your family. eg


- + The temperature of the house
- + The time you go to your bedroom at night and leave it in the morning
- + How and when you are moving around the house

If anything out of the ordinary occurs, your family will be informed and they can then check that you are ok.

How Canary works

Canary monitors many normal daily activities, using discreet sensors that are placed around the home, to check everything is as it should be.

It does not use cameras or microphones so you cannot be seen or heard.



Setting up Canary

Canary has been designed to be very easy to install without any professional help. You don't need a phone line or broadband. The sensors are wireless and can be stuck on the wall by simply peeling off the tape on the back of them.
